*Concerns about a child's well being is to go through Jenny Hogan or Kerrie Hill



Program Information for Families 2023

Dear Families, congratulations! Your child/relative is a participant in the Creative Lands Festival Program

The Creative Lands Festival is a partnership between The Royal Children's Hospital Mental Health, NESAY – youth, family and community, Indigo Shire Council, and seven schools in the region. Our aim is to improve the mental health and wellbeing of young people through arts and culture.

During Term 3 - Term 4, your child/relative will be working with an artist in school for **8 weeks** to learn new skills, develop confidence and create something awesome to present at the combined schools' event. Some children are doing circus, others drumming, others are exploring song writing, Aboriginal arts, videography, spoken word poetry, hip hop dance or cartooning, and visual arts. The artist will teach your child/relative the art form through a mental health promoting lens.

This year we are focusing on PERSITENCE. This theme has been selected because teachers, wellbeing staff and artists observed that last year children and young people could benefit from additional support to give things a go and understand what being persistent is and why it is important for our mental health. In the program we aim to address this as students practically learn a new art form and create a performance or presentation to share with others – experiencing the positive benefits of persisting!

After the 8 week program of workshops, schools will come together for a theatre-style festival event to share their creations. The opportunity for children to have a real life experience, performing or presenting in front of others, is where a large part of building courage, resilience and joy happens.

CASEA Consultation Sessions for Parents

The CYMHS and Schools Early Action (CASEA) Program is an early intervention program for primary school students. It aims to help children develop their social and emotional skills; to support parents and/or care givers; and offers additional supports, learning and consultation to school staff. The CASEA team is made up of allied health professionals, and is a part of the Child and Youth Mental Health Service (CYMHS).

CASEA is currently offering parent consults in your school. This is an opportunity to talk with members of our team about any concerns you may have in relation to your child's social and emotional wellbeing. Consultation sessions are generally for 1 hour.


CASEA can offer support and information on topics such as:

- Ways to respond to children's emotions
- What children need to develop socially and emotionally, along with ways to meet these needs
- Calming/regulation strategies
- Parenting styles & strategies
- Referral pathways to access further support
